

Pulse Cleaning System - Frequently Asked Questions

- **Do pads come with the Rubbermaid Pulse system?**
No. The user must buy pads separately.
- **What is the best pad to use with the Rubbermaid Pulse system?**
For smaller jobs, use the standard Q410 wet pad. For larger jobs and areas that require a faster dry time, use the Q416 High Absorbency Pad.
- **Can I use the Rubbermaid Pulse system to apply floor finish?**
No. The new Rubbermaid Flow™ finish system is for finish applications. Finish will clog the Pulse.
- **What chemicals can I use in the Rubbermaid Pulse?**
Neutral floor cleaners, quat or phenolic disinfectants, and ceramic tile floor cleaners. Do NOT use Bleach in the Rubbermaid Pulse.
- **Which microfiber pads can I use with the Rubbermaid Pulse?**
The Rubbermaid Pulse™ comes with an 18" frame, so use any 18" wet pad. If you choose to add an 11" or 24" frame, also use the wet pads with them as well.
- **Can I dust mop with the Rubbermaid Pulse?**
Absolutely! The Rubbermaid Pulse™ is designed to not drip and leak like many competitive units. Therefore, you can use an appropriately sized dust pad first and then switch to a wet pad before dispensing liquid.
- **Will the Rubbermaid Pulse leak if laid on its side?**
No. The Rubbermaid Pulse™ will not leak, even if stored upside down.
- **Does the Rubbermaid Pulse replace the Q950 Charging Bucket?**
No. Some will still prefer using the Charging Bucket system. Each has its advantages. You can actually use the Pulse WITH the Charging Bucket. For instance, when cleaning in health care it is common to clean the vinyl tile floor in the patient room with a neutral cleaner (fill Charging Bucket with Neutral Cleaner) and then clean the tile bathroom with a disinfectant (Fill Rubbermaid Pulse with Disinfectant).
